Episode 1: Back to Basics

The Church brings us to the desert of Lent to have greater intimacy with God and to empty ourselves of our comforts and worldly

distractions. Some things to contemplate are:

- How can I love the Lord better and make the Lord more the center of my life?
- What draws my heart but is not God?
- What do I need to work on the most?

Be intentional and specific about what has to happen to make more room for God. The Lord is abundantly merciful. He is delighted that we are striving to make more space in our heart and in our day to make Him more the center of our life.



Ultimately, having a fruitful Lent means you love the Lord more on Easter Sunday than you do today – that you put your relationship with the Lord first and said "Yes" to Him.

Prayer: A relationship with God takes time and intentionality. We belong to our Creator and by praying we become more who we were made to be. Making daily time to converse with God can be as simple as turning off the radio while driving, taking a 5-min walk at lunch, adding a Morning Offering or a Spiritual Communion to your day, and praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

Fasting: Our soul is hungering and thirsting for the things of God. Cutting out the non-essentials of life helps us long for God the way the deer longs for running streams. Where are there imbalances in our life regarding social media, music, entertainment, food? Choose something to live without—and do it for the love of God.

Almsgiving: Acts of penance, sacrifice and justice where we have mercy on someone in need, remind us of what God has given us. Our challenge—to make a human connection and give of our time and self, which is often more precious than money.

REMINDER on FASTING and ABSTINENCE



All Fridays of the year are days of abstinence from meat, but Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day. However, during Lent, penance is an important

requirement of Christian life. This duty involves prayer, works of piety and charity, and self-denial by fulfilling one's obligations more faithfully—especially by observing the prescribed fast and abstinence.

Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat) for all Catholics aged 14 or older. On Ash Wednesday & Good Friday, those 18 to 59 must also fast (limit the amount of food) on those days.
