Cardinal Raymond Burke is an American Cardinal, who founded the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Wisconsin.

"Seven years from now, in the year 2031, the Church will celebrate the 500th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe to Saint Juan Diego.

Filled with the confidence which Our Lady of Guadalupe gives to us and imitating her example, let us be confident and courageous in carrying out this nine-month novena and consecration, so that the truth of His dwelling with us in the Church may shine forth for all to see.



Nearly 60,000 Catholics thus far have pledged to join me in the Novena. May Our Lady of Guadalupe, through us who seek to imitate her messenger, Saint Juan Diego, draw all souls to her Divine Son and to His Mystical Body, the Church."
