### CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH on HOPE

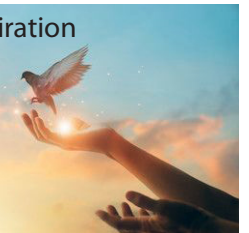


Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ’s promises *and relying*

*not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit.* “Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised it is faithful.”

***“The Holy Spirit . . . he poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life.”***

The virtue of hope responds to the aspiration to happiness which God has placed in the heart of every man; it takes up the hopes that inspire men’s activities and purifies them so as to order them to the Kingdom of heaven; it keeps man from discouragement; it sustains him during times of abandonment; it opens up his heart in expectation of eternal beatitude. Buoyed up by hope, he is preserved from selfishness and led to the happiness that flows from charity.

## IMPORTANT REMINDER

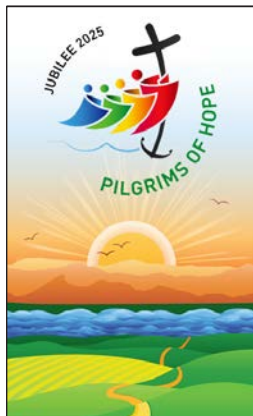
Parents and Confirmation candidates are reminded they should attend the wrap-up session on **Sun, May 25th** following socializing after the 10 am Mass.
