Stewardship Bulletin Bit

"I give you a new commandment: love one another.
As I have loved you, so you also should love one another."

—John 13:34

"As I have loved you," this is the hard part – Jesus's love is unconditional; our love usually comes with strings attached. It is easy to love someone when they love you back. But it takes mercy and compassion to love someone when you feel unappreciated, feel used or feel like your opinion doesn't matter. It takes courage and the grace of God to "love my neighbour" when they may be someone you don't like, someone you don't know, or someone that doesn't look like you.

BLESSING OF THE FIELDS



After Sunday Mass on May 25th, Fr Malone will bless the fields that our church farms. It will be video recorded for viewing the week afterwards.

The blessing of fields traditionally would take place on the weekdays before the Ascension of the Lord, and were called the **Days of the Minor Litanies**, or alternatively as the **Lesser Days of Rogation**—"rogation" just being another word for "asking", since we ask of God both

His mercy on us and His providential care for the flourishing of the fields.

Jesus, in His Incarnation a human being and Resurrecting in His Body, indicates to us that we can



invite the presence of God into all situations and upon all manner of material things. So, Fr Malone is reserving the rest of May 25th and most of May 26th, 27th & 28th to be available for blessing fields of any parishioners who request it.

The rite for blessing the field takes approximately 15-20 minutes. Requests can be made through the office or directly with Fr Malone. If a time outside of those days is required, that can be arranged, too.

ADORATION UPDATE

Going forward, Holy Hour will be every Thursday from 6 - 7 pm. Every First Friday there will be Eucharistic Adoration from



9:30 am to 1:30 pm. This practice allows for a deeper relationship with Christ, strengthens faith, and provides a unique opportunity for prayer and contemplation, bringing to Jesus all our cares, concerns and hopes.


