Bishop Erik Varden, ocso, is a Norwegian Catholic prelate, spiritual writer, and Trappist monk. He shares this reflection on Trinity Sunday.

Christ and the coming of the Spirit, God has drawn infinitely closer. He has drawn us into the mystery of Himself and His inner life of love.

We rediscover ourselves as children, longing for our Father's love. Our God

is a God who delights in sharing Himself. He pours Himself out and gives Himself freely and receives with open arms the love we show Him in return.

The desire of God, Father, Son and Spirit is to attract all mankind into His current of Divine Love, which is the source of all life. We give thanks to God for this gift of His life, bestowed on us in the Church. We wish to keep true to His word.

Let us make a fresh resolve to adore our adorable God in Spirit and truth, standing silently before Him in wonder, awe and praise.

Cuernavaca Project

Archbishop Charles Halpin from Regina, along with his friend Bishop Sergio Mendes from Mexico, created CED (Center for Encounters and



Dialogue). Both Bishops wanted an organization that could help the people of Cuernavaca build a sustainable economy for themselves and prevent future generations from falling into the poverty cycle of joining gangs and migrating to the US. CED has worked to start an artist's cooperative, build kitchens in schools and communities for abandoned children, build day cares, soup kitchens, food banks, and education for women. Since 1991 the Archdiocese has been taking groups of teens and adults to Mexico to participate in these projects. This has been a life changing experience for all who have participated—including His Grace, Don Bolen, the first chaplain of the Cuernavaca Project and longtime supporter.

NEXT weekend, Joan Rink of the Archdiocese and Carmen Bahena, Director of the CED, will be speaking before Mass, and after Mass will entertain questions & sell items from Mexico in support of the Center.




SHARE LENT UPDATE

Under Development & Peace's five-year theme, **Create Hope**, this year's "Reaping Our Rights"

campaign focused on small-scale peasant farmers in the Global South. So far the overall campaign has raised \$2,247,548.56—and over 50,000 signatures in support of environmental defenders were delivered to the Honduran Ambassador.
