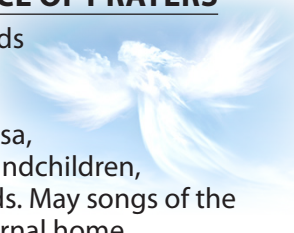

*"Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them and they all drank from it."*

## FEAST of CORPUS CHRISTI



*The Catholic Church honors Christ's Presence in the Holy Eucharist with a special feast owing to St Juliana of Liège, a 13th-century Norbertine canoness from Belgium.*

St Juliana had a great love for the Eucharist. When she was 16, she had a vision in which the Church was a full moon with a dark spot. The dark spot signified that the Church was missing a feast dedicated solely to the Body and Blood of Christ.

She had this vision several times, but didn't think that she could do anything to help institute this feast. She kept it a secret for many years. Once she was elected prioress, she finally told her confessor, who in turn told the bishop. This eventually led to the universal feast of Corpus Christi.



The Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life" (Lumen gentium, no. 11). In the Eucharist, Jesus Himself re-presents for our benefit His Sacrifice on Calvary that gives Himself to us in Holy Communion, and remains among us until the end of the age. He comes to us in this humble form, making Himself vulnerable, out of love for each one of us.

Yet, as God Himself, the Body and Blood of Christ deserves our utmost respect and love, as well as our adoration.

## Cuernavaca Project



Archbishop Charles Halpin from Regina, along with his friend Bishop Sergio Mendes from Mexico, created CED (Center for Encounters and Dialogue). Both Bishops wanted an organization that could help the people of Cuernavaca build a sustainable economy for themselves and prevent future generations from falling into the poverty cycle of joining gangs and migrating to the US. CED has worked to start an artist's cooperative, build kitchens in schools and communities for abandoned children, build day cares, soup kitchens, food banks, and education for women. Since 1991 the Archdiocese has been taking groups of teens and adults to Mexico to participate in these projects. This has been a life changing experience for all who have participated—including His Grace, Don Bolen, the first chaplain of the Cuernavaca Project and longtime supporter.

*This weekend, Joan Rink of the Archdiocese and Carmen Bahena, Director of the CED, will be speaking before Mass, and after Mass will entertain questions & sell items from Mexico in support of the Center.*
