

NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST



Only three birthdays are celebrated on the Church's liturgical calendar—the Nativity of Our Lord (Dec 25), the Nativity of His Mother (Sept 8), and the Nativity of His forerunner, John the Baptist, on June 24.

St John the Baptist was set apart from the womb to prepare the way of the Lord and was a significant figure

connected to the Incarnation and the Redemption. The Church honors him because of his role in preparing the way for Christ.

God sent many prophets to speak to us before Jesus. This is because at first, He tried to speak to us Himself, and we disobeyed. He chose men throughout history to be prophets, to teach others about Him. Throughout the Old Testament, people were even unfaithful to God through the teachings and leading



of the prophets. God sent prophets like John the Baptist to soften their hearts, call them to repentance, and truly prepare people for Christ's coming so they'd be able to recognize Him and receive Him when they encountered Him. John was the last of these, and the greatest.

SUMMER TO MEAL PROGRAM


The Knights, CWL and Social Justice
