### **SEPTEMBER: DEDICATED to OUR LADY of SORROWS**



Throughout Church history, various orders and saints have had a special devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows, focusing on prayer and penance.

September became known as the month of Our Lady of Sorrows because her feast day of that title had been fittingly appointed for September 15th, the day following The Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

Although the Blessed Virgin endured more interior pain than we can comprehend, the Church has given us seven sorrows on which we can meditate. Our Lady herself has promised graces to those who honor her in this way.

- 1. St Simeon's Prophesy
- 2. The Flight into Egypt
- 3. The Loss of Jesus in the Temple
- 4. The Meeting of Jesus and Mary on the Way of the Cross
- 5. The Crucifixion
- 6. Mary Receives the Body of Jesus taken down from the Cross
- 7. The Burial of Jesus
