#### **CELEBRATING our ARCHDIOCESAN PATRON**



Each diocese in Canada has a patron feast based on the name of their cathedral. In order to promote unity and community with **Holy Rosary Cathedral** in Regina, our deanery parishes will be celebrating the Archdiocesan Patronal Feast Day on **Monday, October 7th.** This is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. We will start

with a rosary procession at 8:30 am, followed by Mass at 9:00 am and then coffee and fellowship.

### Stewardship Bulletin Bit

"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

—Mark 9:35

Jesus teaches us that we are called to love one another. Love involves sacrifice. Sacrifice is a word that many of us don't like to hear. We think it means that we must give up something that we want. However, the literal meaning of sacrifice is "to make holy," from the words "sacer" = sacred and "facere" = to make. So, when we sacrifice, we make our lives holy by sharing our gifts in the service of God.

#### LIFE CHAIN — 1st SUNDAY OF OCTOBER



Life Chain is an annual, hourlong, prayerful, peaceful, pro-life public witness on the first Sunday of October (sometimes called "Respect Life Sunday").

It was started in 1987 by a group in Yuba City, California, called *Please Let Me Live*. Campaign Life Coalition brought the event to Canada in 1990.

Its premise is simple: pro-lifers gather at a pre-determined intersection in their community. An organizer hands out signs bearing messages like *"Abortion Hurts Women," "Adoption: A Loving Option,"* and *"Jesus Forgives & Heals."* Participants are spaced out along the side of a street, forming a long "chain." They pray quietly for one hour for an end to abortion, and for God's mercy for all those affected by it. At the end, they return the signs to the organizer.

Last year, 325 Canadian communities participated pro-lifers from every province (and Yukon!) came out.



Does this sound like something you could do this year? Even if you've never done any sort of activism before, can you hold a sign and pray?

Please mark the event in your calendar — **Sunday**, **October 6th at 2 pm**. We park at Regier Honda and hold signs between the south service road and Hwy #1.
