# Stewardship Bulletin Bit

"John answered them all, 'I baptize you with water; but he who is mightier than I is coming...he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit...'"

—Luke 3:16

The Catholic Catechism states that "Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God's will." In other words, as baptized Catholics there is only one gift that we need to give to Jesus – the gift of ourselves. Surrender yourself to God, place your trust in Him and allow the Holy Spirit to work through you for the greater glory of God.

## JUBILEE 2025: December 24, 2024 to January 6, 2026



This Holy Year is a special year of atonement and remission of sins, debts and the punishment due to sin.

The practice has ancient roots in the

Jewish tradition (Lev 25). In the Old Testament, a Jubilee was observed every 50 years to restore relationship with God. The practice was adopted by the Catholic Church in 1300 by Pope Boniface VIII, and in 1470 Pope Paul II declared that a Jubilee take place every 25 years.

Jubilee 2025 was officially opened on December 24, 2024 with a Mass presided over by Pope Francis in St Peter's Square, followed by the Rite of the Opening of the Holy Door. "There is only one way that opens wide the entrance into the life of communion with God: this is Jesus, the one and



absolute way to salvation." (St John Paul II)

The way in which Jubilee Years are marked has changed through the centuries. Originally the Holy Year consisted of a pilgrimage to the Roman Basilicas of St Peter and St Paul, later other signs were added, such as the Holy Door. By participating in the Holy Year, one is granted a plenary indulgence. (This will be explored further next week.)



The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (Jan 18 - 25, 2025) is an annual ecumenical celebration. Christians around the world are invited to pray for the unity of all Christians, to reflect on scripture together, to participate in jointlyorganized ecumenical services, and to share fellowship. In Swift Current there will be an Interdenominational Worship Service on January 23 at St Olaf Lutheran Church at 6:30 pm followed by the *Drive*, *Pray*, *Bless* event at 7:00 pm. Participants will go in groups to pray at different locations in our city such as at churches, schools, city hall, and many more. This was a very successful and touching event last year. You do not need to register: just show up and simple instructions will be given after the service.

#### **UNDERSTANDING THE LOGO** (condensed from an article by Sr Dianne Sehn, Ursuline Consultant)

The logo is an image rich in symbolism. Chosen from nearly 300 proposals, it captures an invitation for all to walk together towards a better future, guided by faith and the will to build a better world marked by mercy and community. This hope is underscored by the motto of the Jubilee 2025, prominently displayed in green at the bottom of the logo: "Pilgrims of Hope."

The logo depicts four stylized and graceful figures, in four colours that recall the shades of the rainbow. Red symbolizes love, passion, and self-sacrifice, Christ's sacrifice and his boundless love for humanity, but also the fire of the Holy Spirit and His strength that animates Christians. Orange expresses joy, vitality, and enthusiasm, the light that illuminates the path of faith.

Green is universally recognized as the colour of hope, growth, and rebirth. Blue, finally, symbolizes faith, peace, and tranquillity, evoking the sky and spirituality, and inviting contemplation and prayer.

The four figures represent all of humanity in its differences and similarities. They proceed to embrace each other, expressing the solidarity and community that should unite the peoples of the world.

Leading them is the red figure, clinging to a Cross formed by a black curve that ends, at the bottom, with an anchor. The Cross is not rigid, not static, but bends towards humanity as if to embrace it.

PILGRIMSON The anchor has often been used as a metaphor for hope. The sense of this symbol in the Jubilee logo is clear: it is precisely in the most difficult moments that we need to rely on an anchor that gives us security and guarantees salvation. And what better anchor than the Cross, a symbol of Christ and His infinite love for all of us?

> The presence of small, agitated waves at the bottom of the logo confirms the existence of dangers and obstacles, of those personal events and events of the world that make each of our lives not always easy. Thus, the logo takes on a clear meaning, and the Jubilee becomes a long pilgrimage to be undertaken together, as brothers and sisters, towards salvation, guided by the Cross and the hope of salvation promised by God.
