## ST TERESA OF AVILA - Feast Day October 15



*Teresa of Avila is a saint and Doctor of the Church. A Carmelite nun and reformer, she once said, "Our souls are like castles in the Kingdom of God."*

Teresa's Interior Castle is filled with many insights about the power of contemplative prayer that leads you to see your soul as a castle created by God, reminiscent of His Kingdom. In prayer, you journey through the many rooms or "mansions" of your soul, ultimately discovering God at the center.



For Teresa, prayer is really about becoming friends with God. "For mental prayer, in my opinion, is nothing else than an intimate sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with Him who we know loves us."
