## THE DEDICATION OF CHURCHES



*Not only does the Church commemorate the events of our Lord's life on earth and the lives of Our Lady and the saints, but it also commemorates the dedication of churches.*

To remind all Catholics of our connection to Rome and the Pope, the church universally celebrates the Lateran Basilica (the Pope's cathedral) on Nov 9, the Basilicas of Saints Peter & Paul in Rome on Nov 18, and the Basilica of St Mary Major on Aug 5.

Why should we celebrate a building? The meaning of "church" is borrowed from a Greek word meaning "belonging to the Lord." Every church, then, where we assemble on Sunday, is a joyful and reassuring sign of Emmanuel, "God among us."

In our parish, we observe the dedication of Christ the Redeemer on July 5; of St Anne in Gull Lake on July 6, and of St Joseph in Cabri on Nov 24.

In our archdiocese, the dedication of Holy Rosary Cathedral (Nov 24) falls on Christ the King Sunday, so will not be observed this year.

*This week, on October 22, churches whose date of consecration is unknown will celebrate the solemnity of their dedication.*
