Stewardship Bulletin Bit

"And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself' is worth more than all the burnt offerings and sacrifices."

—Mark 12:33

God wants us to share out of love for Him, not out of obligation. Using our talent in parish ministry and financially supporting our parish mission is important, but it's more important to spend time in daily prayer with God and discern how He is calling us to be generous with all of our gifts—not just the visible ones, but the invisible ones like love, mercy and forgiveness.

UNDERSTANDING PURGATORY



November is the month dedicated by the Church to pray for our beloved dead in purgatory.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches "all who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of the eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (CCC 1030) This final purification is purgatory, which involves a "purifying fire" but is "entirely different from the punishment of the damned." (CCC 1031)

We know there is purgatory from Holy Scripture (see Mc 12:42-46 and 1 Cor 3:12-15), the teaching of the church, and tradition. As for the pains



of purgatory, they cannot be alleviated by any effort of the souls themselves. St Augustine says, "The fire of purgatory is more terrible than all that man can suffer in this life."

We can help the souls in purgatory (CCC 1032) by offering prayers for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice. The Church also commends alms giving, indulgences and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead.


