DECEMBER 12: Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast Day



Patroness of the Americas, these are the words spoken by Our Lady of Guadalupe to St Juan Diego in the 1500s:

Listen, put it into your heart, most little of my sons: Let nothing frighten or grieve you, let not your

heart be disturbed,

Do not fear any sickness or anguish. Am I not here, who am your Mother? Are you not under my protection? Am I not your health?

Are you not happily within the folds of my mantle, held safely in my arms? Do you need anything more?

Let nothing else worry you or disturb you.'

Our Lady of Guadalupe represents hope and a renewal of faith. Within 10 years of Our Lady of Guadalupe's appearance to a peasant, Juan Diego, on a hilltop near Mexico City in 1531, between 9 and 10 million of his fellow Indigenous people, hitherto adamantly polytheistic and suspicious of the conquering Spaniards' religion, converted to the Catholic faith. The credit for this mass conversion, the largest in history, goes to the striking image of Our Lady. Indigenous in appearance herself, she miraculously appeared on Juan Diego's tilma.
