Stewardship Bulletin Bit

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God."

-Philippians 4:6

St Paul reminds us that God is an abundant God – He is the ultimate giver of gifts. He promises to give us all that we need. Remember that we are created in God's image and likeness. We, too, are made to be generous with all of our gifts as well. Placing our trust in God frees us from being a slave to possessions. It allows us to gratefully and generously share ourselves and our goods with others.

THE CELEBRATION OF VESPERS



From December 17th to the 23rd, the Church has a special custom in the celebration of Vespers (Evening Prayer):

The first words of the antiphons for the Canticle of Mary follow this pattern: "O Wisdom", "O Sacred Lord", "O Flower of Jesse's stem", "O Key of David", "O Radiant Dawn",

"O King of all the nations", and finally, "O Emmanuel".



These are the "O" Antiphons; names and titles invoked not just for being Biblical and prophetic allusions to the promised Messiah, but also for

the sake of wordplay. In Latin, these names for Our Lord spell out a two-word phrase backwards with their initials: ERO CRAS, "I will be (here) tomorrow", from "O Sapientia", "O Adonai", "O Radix Jesse", "O Clavis David", "O Oriens", "O Rex Gentium", "O Emmanuel".

Nothing in the Mass or Liturgy of the Hours or in the Sacramental rites is superfluous. Each gesture and phrase is there to glorify God. This thoroughness even in small things gives the Church's worship a fractal-like quality, like the detail within detail within detail one can find in the beauty of the natural world.


